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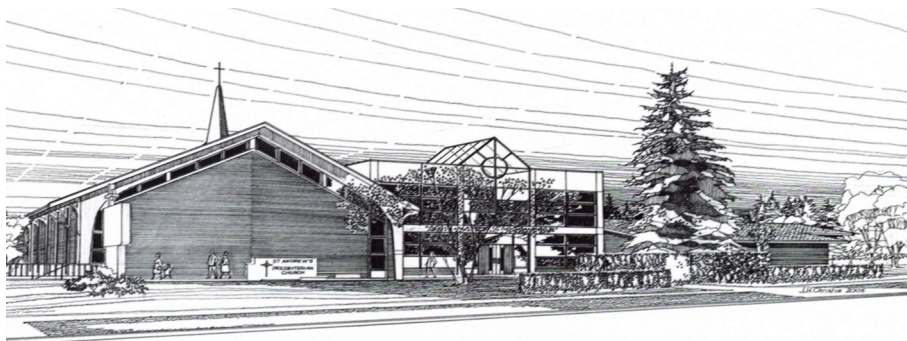
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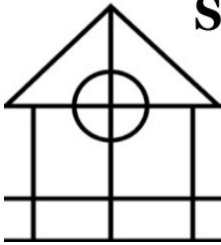

"Mental Health: A Christian Response"

Sooner or later, mental illness touches us all. It may be a colleague at work, a friend, a family member. Often these people are shunned as though mental illness was contagious. And that is the last thing they need. How should a Christian respond? The answers can grow from simple steps of caring, and receiving better education.

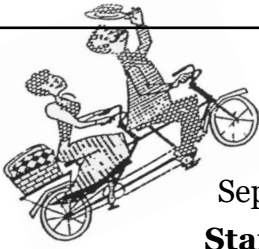
The Mission Team, supported by the Pastoral Care Team of St. Andrew's, has organised an evening seminar on Wednesday October 3 at 6:30 p.m. in the Karl English Lounge at St. Andrew's to address mental health from a Christian perspective. This panel (St. Andrew's Minister, two Christian Psychologists, and a person to share their experiences) will explore mental illness from a broad perspective, the intersection of faith and psychology, and what the church can do to help. We hope to examine common myths and begin to put the stigma of mental illness behind us.

As an evening, it may be a little shocking but it will definitely be an interesting exploration of a challenge many of us either may choose to ignore or have difficulty talking about. Child Care will be provided, there will be light sandwich snacks before we start and a free will offering will be taken. Sign up at the Volunteer Corner.
