The Art of Neighbouring

How much time do you invest in caring for your neighbours? How many of the neighbours on your street can you name? How many of your neighbours know your name? For those who follow Jesus, neighbours are important people. Reformed Theologian Walter Brueggemann reminds us that, "the neighbour is the epicentre of the gospel." Consider how many times Jesus points us to the needs of our neighbour—whether reminding us that the most important commandment is to "love God and love neighbour," or in the Parable of the Good Samaritan demonstrating that the plight of our neighbours really matters.

It is in our everyday relationships with others that Kingdom love, peace and justice are administered. Christian faith is an active faith—it's about doing; and it's about such everyday action being holy action. The First Letter of John (4:7) says, "Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another." Or even more to the point, "The command we have from Christ is blunt: Loving God includes loving people. You've got to love both." 1 John 4:21 (The Message)

One of the misfortunes in the long history of the church, as Brueggemann reminds us, is that we have mistakenly separated love of God from love of neighbour; whereas in Scripture they are together in prophetic poetry. Faithful neighbouring includes being active advocates for the vulnerable and the marginalized and people without resources. And this becomes a way to act out and exhibit one's love of God. So love of God gets translated into love of neighbours.

The enlivening invitation of Kingdom ministry is bringing your gifts, offering them in service—and under Jesus' guidance letting him do with them whatever he wishes. And why is this so important? If we look closely into our neighbour's eyes and listen carefully to what they say—we will actually see Jesus there—because the stranger/neighbour brings a divine gift. As Jesus said in Matthew 25:40, "just as you did it to the least of these, you did it to me."

Mother Theresa's daily prayer went like this: "Dearest Lord, may I see you today and every day in the person of your sick, and whilst nursing minister to you. Though you hide yourself behind the unattractive disguise of the irritable, the exacting, the unreasonable, may I recognize you and say: 'Jesus my patient how sweet it is to serve you.' Lord give me this seeing faith, then my work will never be monotonous."

One of the ways St. Andrew's will corporately show love for our neighbours this month is through the Aboriginal Sharing Day—Breaking the Barriers on May 25th, 1:30-7:30pm. Read about details on subsequent pages of ConnXions and plan to be part of this important event. Also, June 15th is Neighbour Day in the City of Calgary—what might you do for your neighbours?

The Event, the Artist and the Art

Over the past many months, a small group of St. Andrew's people have linked with indigenous leaders from the Aboriginal Friendship Centre to co-host an Aboriginal Sharing Day on May 25th, 2019. Our broad objective has been to extend and expand mutual understanding and acceptance within our respective communities. The opening ceremony will take place at 1:30 pm in front of two tipis mounted on our front lawn. Educational demonstrations by First Nations' volunteers will be enhanced with drumming and dancing throughout the event, and a bison feast will conclude the day. There is no charge for attendance.

To facilitate advertising for the event, Ernie Poundmaker from the Aboriginal Friendship Centre suggested that we contact Kalum Teke Dan, a local indigenous artist, well known among the aboriginal community. We discussed the matter over lunch with Kalum, and he agreed we could use one of his recent art pieces (entitled "The Hand") to enhance the text messages about activities on the day. The result was the creation of two posters, a smaller one suitable for posting on bulletin boards, and 30 copies of a larger one (11" X 17") that will be signed and numbered by the artist. The signed posters will be available for sale at \$35.00. A digital version of that poster is shown here.

Kalum has become increasingly well known in

southern Alberta over the past two decades. His artwork can be viewed locally as a 32' X 36' mural on the west side of a building on 17th Ave. and 12th Street S.W.; and in the new Public Library as one of three large murals to the left as you enter the building. He recently received a substantial contract with the City of Calgary to paint a mural on the sides of a pillar (4' X 4' X 50') inside City Hall in recognition of the 125th anniversary of Calgary, and as part of a reconciliation initiative by the city. We are privileged to have his contribution to this Aboriginal Sharing Event.

Stewards By Design

Five members of St. Andrew's, including Rev. Dr. Tim Archibald, will be travelling to Orillia, Ontario for the Stewards by Design conference May 2nd - 5th. The conference, which is offered by the Presbyterian Church in Canada and facilitated by advisor Dr. Kennon Callaghan, is designed to help congregations discover how to nurture generous giving and expand their ministry.

Dr. Callaghan is a pastor and consultant to Christian congregations throughout North America and the world. He is also the author of numerous books beginning with "Twelve Keys to an Effective Church", which focuses on assisting local churches in their strategic long-range planning. Dr. Tim Archibald has attended Stewards by Design in the past. We are grateful for the St. Andrew's Legacy Fund for funding the team's expenses for the conference, a total of \$600 per person including flights.

Course participants explore Stewardship as not just about giving and money, but as a spiritual matter concerned with all aspects of life. Participants learn how congregations might engage in mission and ministry and learn about different ways that people give and a different way of thinking about our church and community. Each member of the team has been given Dr. Callaghan's book, Twelve Keys to an Effective Church to read and discuss. Then they will need to develop a church profile for background of St. Andrew's; it's demographics, finances, mission projects, ministry and lay leadership in preparation for the weekend conference including consultation time with Dr. Callaghan. The team's task will be to develop a plan unique to St. Andrew's to allow our congregation to discover ways to "nurture faithful giving and abundant living."

Your prayers for Rev. Dr. Tim Archibald, Cathy Millar, Stephanie Werle, David Platt and Elaine Cantlon would be greatly appreciated as we journey together in faith to discern more clearly how God is calling us to respond to His grace and goodness in our lives.


Fall Alpha

Alpha returns to St. Andrew's this fall on Wednesday evenings (beginning mid-September). Alpha is about sharing God's love through friendship; it is a welcoming place to explore life, faith and meaning. Task Force for Renewal

As described in the April edition of ConnXions, the Renewal Task Force has been developing a reVisioning process for St. Andrew's. This will involve everyone at St. Andrew's in a variety of steps and forms of engagement. The plans include seven steps, as described below:

1. Prayer Group

- Establishment of one or two groups of 4-5 people who will pray for discernment on a weekly basis throughout the reVisioning process. The group (or groups) will pray for the Spirit of God to open the congregation and its leaders to discern more clearly God's vision and purpose for ministry as a congregation. The plan is for these groups to be up and running by September, 2019.
- 2. 5-day Silent Retreat for the Ministers
 - Dr. Tim and Rev. Jared will take separate 5-day silent retreats before the end of the summer, 2019.
- 3. 4-week Study Series for Elders
 - This 4-week study during the month of October, 2019 will be focused on growing spiritual leadership skills for the elders and will involve weekly small group meetings using a resource such as the "Spirit Led Leader" by Timothy Geoffrion.

4. Elder Prayer Partners

• Throughout the ReVisioning process, each of the elders will be paired up with another elder to provide an opportunity for discussion, mutual support and prayer.

5. Congregational Discernment Event

• A coming together of members/adherents of the congregation in small table groups with a short study of scripture followed by questions where members/adherents are asked a series of questions such as "what is unique about St. Andrew's?" to help us find commonality and develop our vision together. Each member/adherent would be asked to attend one of the two scheduled congregational discernment events on Sunday, Oct. 20th or Sunday Oct. 27th, 2019.

6. 4-week Worship Series for the Congregation


- The worship series, which will include four different Sunday sermons, will take place over a period of five weeks and will mirror the study for the elders. The period of five weeks enables members/adherents to also take part in a congregational discernment event on one of the two Sundays as set out in the schedule below.
- The current schedule for the worship series and congregational discernment events are as follows:
 - Oct. 6th sermon #1 at both services
 - o Oct. 13th sermon #2 at both services (Thanksgiving)
 - Oct. 20th sermon #3 at 9:30 service. No regular church service at 11:15 rather, a congregational discernment event at 11:15 am (1.5 hours)
 - Oct. 27th sermon #4 at 11:15 service. No regular church service at 9:30 rather, a congregational discernment event at 9:30 am (1.5 hours)
 - o Nov. 3rd sermon #5 at both services

7. Elder Retreat

• Anticipated to be held on Saturday, November 9th, 2019, drawing the process to a conclusion with the articulation of a vision for St. Andrew's, so that we are better able to become a living reflection of that vision and of God's purpose. The clear articulation of that vision will better enable St. Andrew's to become a place of purpose, presence and power.

The Task Force, under the leadership of Dr. Tim, includes Rev. Jared, Rhonda Wishart, Cathy Millar, Craig Murray, Lynn Judd, Kevin MacFarlane, Debby Dorcas and David Platt. We, the members of the Task Force, continue to be enthused about this journey and its possibilities for St. Andrew's! Please feel free to ask questions of any member of the Task Force.
